

2026-27 Provincial Championships, Tournaments & Events LOGISTICS

Entry Procedures:

To enter all events on the calendar participants must send an email to the Bowls Sask office listing the event they wish to enter and along with the names of the other athletes (if they are a team). A confirmation email will be returned from the office manager. If one is not received within 24 hours contact the office to ensure your entry was received.

Age Eligibility (youth, junior and senior triples only):

The age restrictions are; Youth/U18 must be 12 years of age as of January 1, 2026, and under 18 years of age as of December 31, 2026; Junior/U25 must be at least 18 years of age as of January 1, 2026, and under 25 years of age as of December 31, 2026; Senior Triples must be 65 years of age or older as of January 1, 2026.

Restrictions

Team athletes (Pairs, Fours & Senior Triples) may represent Saskatchewan in only ONE TEAM DISCIPLINE at the 2026 National Championships

Entry Fees:

The entry fee for each event per participant/athlete is below. Entry fees for all events MUST be paid at time of entry. If entering a team, payment for all teammates must be in one payment. Payments are to be sent via e-transfer to bowlsask@sasktel.net. A receipt from Bowls Sask will be sent via email to the person who paid.

Conditions of Play:

The Conditions of Play for each provincial championship and tournament above will be contained in the Sport for All Policies & Procedures found on the Bowls Sask website. A poster for the Grassroots Tournament will also be posted as links to the calendar on the Bowls Sask website.

2026 BCB Canadian Championships LOGISTICS

Entry Procedures:

Bowls Sask will notify Bowls Canada (BCB) of those representing Saskatchewan at the Canadian Championships at the conclusion of the Provincial Championship (will be the gold medalists). Each athlete must then register directly with BCB via the procedures outlined on the BCB website for that respective Canadian Championship.

Each participant must make their own arrangements for travel, accommodations and meals. BCB will secure host hotels for each championship. BCB is negotiating with all hosts to provide ground transportation and meal packages which will be shared on their web site as it becomes available.

NOTE: The Youth/Junior Canadian Championship is an OPEN event such that any youth or junior athlete may enter directly with BCB. Bowls Sask providing funding support ONLY to the gold medalists from the provincial championships.

Entry Fees:

The entry fee for Para, Youth and Junior is \$130/athlete and \$150 per athlete for majors, indoor singles & senior triples. This fee will be collected by Bowls Sask on behalf of BCB. Payments are to be sent via e-transfer to bowlsask@sasktel.net within seven (7) days after the provincial championship. A receipt from Bowls Sask will be sent via email to the person who paid.

Bowls Sask Self-help Fee:

The team gold medalists representing Bowls Sask at the Canadian Championships are required to pay the \$400/athlete self-help fee to Bowls Sask. This can be paid in advance of attending Canadian Championship OR can be subtracted from the expense claim form submitted. Payments are to be via e-transfer as noted above.

Funding:

Bowls Sask will provide \$1200 to each athlete at Majors, Indoor Singles & Senior Triples and \$1500 to each Youth/Junior member of the gold medal team attending the Canadian Championships to cover their expenses (accommodations, travel, meals & registration fee). Athletes must complete and submit the expense form (found on the website) with supporting receipts after the championship to receive their funding.

Note: Accommodation will be funded based on sharing a room as per our Bowls Sask Sask First policy (found on the website). Bowls Sask is not implementing a no-sharing policy.

Conditions of Play:

The Bowls Canada Boulingrin website contains the Conditions of Play for each Canadian Championship. This information must be read by all athletes attending Canadian Championships. There will also be links for each on the Calendar of Events found on the Bowls Sask website once they are available.
